THERE has been established, September 1956, through an initial grant of \$5,000,000 from the Ford Foundation, the Council on Library Resources, Inc., to support research in the problems confronting libraries and development of procedures and techniques to overcome or mitigate these problems. Verner W. Clapp resigned as Chief Assistant Librarian of the Library of Congress to become President of the Council. The board of directors includes university and foundation administrators, librarians, editors, publishers, and business executives. Headquarters of the Coun-

cil are in Washington, D. C. The initial grant of funds from the Ford Foundation is for a five-year period.
