CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

WILLIAM BENTINCK-SMITH has edited the Harvard Alumni Bulletin (1946–1954) and The Harvard Book, which was published by the Harvard University Press in 1953; he was Assistant to the President of Harvard University (1954–1971), and is now Publication Associate in the Development Office of the University and Honorary Curator of Type Specimens and Letter Design in the Harvard College Library.

CLARK A. ELLIOTT, Assistant Curator of the Harvard University Archives, has contributed articles to professional periodicals and is the author of a dissertation (Case Western Reserve University, 1970) on "The American Scientist, 1800-1863: His Origins, Careet, and Interests."

JOHN C. HIRSH is Assistant Professor of English at Georgetown University; his dissertation at Lehigh, in 1970, was on fifteenth-century English devotional poetry.

CORA E. LUTZ, Cataloguer of Pre-1600 Manuscripts in the Yale University Library, wrote her dissertation at Yale on ninth-century Latin commentaries on Martianus Capella, and her editions of commentaries by Dunchad and Joannes Scotus have been published by the American Philological Association and the Mediaeval Academy of America.

JOSEPH SENDRY, Associate Professor of English at The Catholic University of America, is the author of a Harvard dissertation on *In Memoriam* and of "The *In Memoriam* Manuscripts: Some Solutions to the Problems," in the April 1973 issue of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

ROBERT LEE WOLFF, Coolidge Professor of History at Harvard and Syndic of the Harvard University Press, is an historian of the Byzantine and Ottoman Empires and the Balkans; as he noted in his article on Henry Kingsley in the spring 1959 issue of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, "the collecting and reading of nineteenth-century English novels" has been "an agreeable adventure in a field happily far removed from the center of [his] professional interests."
