## A HARVARD LIBRARY BIBLIOGRAPHY: SUPPLEMENT

This is a list of new books and articles of which any unit of the Harvard University Library is the author, the publisher, or the subject. The bibliography for 1960-1966 appeared in the *HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN*, XV (1967), 99-107; for previous supplements see XV, 310-312, and XVI (1968), 95-96, 211, and 404-406.

### I. *Serials and Continuing Works in Parts*

*H U L Notes; News & Notes of the Harvard Libraries*, 1 (September 19, 1968) — (A weekly newsletter for information of the Harvard University Library staff, edited by Louis Sasso.)

*The Harvard Librarian*, VI:1 (October 1968) — (This continues the publication that appeared from December 1957 to May 1966. It will now be published monthly during the academic year, and will be made available to members of the Faculty, Friends of the Library, and others who request it, as well as to members of the staff. The Editor is Louis Sasso.)

Technical Reports Collection. *Bulletin*, 67 (November 15, 1967) — (The *Accessions List* of the Technical Reports Collection was discontinued with No 66, November 15, 1966; the *Bulletin*, containing a selected list, replaces it and continues the numbering.)

———. Library. *Guides to the Harvard Libraries*, 1 (1947) — No 8 (Revised ed.) — *A Guide to the Gordon McKay Library, Division of Engineering and Applied Physics, Harvard University* (1967).

*Theological Currents*, 1 (June 1968) — (A monthly guide to the contents of selected periodicals and festschriften received by the Andover-Harvard Theological Library, made up of photographic reproductions of title pages.)

Berlin, Charles, "The Judaica Collection at Harvard," *Jewish Book Annual*, XXVI (1968-1969), 58-63. (This incorporates portions of Dr. Berlin's introduction to the 6-volume Harvard University Library *Catalogue of Hebrew Books*, which was listed in the previous supplement to this bibliography.)

- Dickinson, Emily. *Two Poems*, Published by Walker and Company, New York, in association with the Department of Printing and Graphic Arts, Harvard College Library, 1968. [15] p. ("Marie Angel pinxit et scripsit, 1966." As explained in the prefatory note by Philip Hofer and Eleanor M. Garvey, "this new printing does not claim literary significance. Its value lies, rather, in Marie Angel's exquisite drawing and color and in her lettering, arranged as a harmonious composition emphasizing the significant words." The Meriden Gravure Company has reproduced "this work in the colors of the original drawings on vellum. It has taken them several years, and countless proofs, to reach the almost perfect facsimile achieved here." Copies are sold for \$3.00, and 500 copies signed by the artist and placed in a special box case are available for \$10.00 each.)
