### CORRIGENDA

#### Vol. XVI, No. 4 (October 1968)

In the article on "The Third Lecture," p. 354, Paul Dudley (1675-1751) should have been described as the grandson of the second governor of Massachusetts, not "of the first governor."

#### Vol. XVII, No. 1 (January 1969)

In "Mrs. Henry Draper and the Harvard College Observatory: 1883-1887," on page 80, footnote 24 should read: Later work showed that Draper was indeed correct. The spectrum of  $\alpha$  Aquilae contains many metallic lines not visible in that of  $\alpha$  Lyrae, and  $\alpha$  Aquilae is definitely of a later spectral type.
