CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

DOUGLAS W. BRYANT is University Librarian, Director of the Harvard University Library, Professor of Bibliography, and Associate of Quincy House. The most recent of his previous contributions to the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, in October 1974, was "The Changing Research Library."

ALAN T. MCKENZIE, Associate Professor of English at Purdue University, is the author of "The Scriblerus Club Poems to 'Gulliver's Travels,'" a University of Pennsylvania dissertation (1968), and of a number of articles, including "A New Letter from Giuseppe Baretti to 'Thomas Hollis'" in the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN for April 1971.

BRIDGET PUZON, O.S.U., is Assistant Professor of English and Assistant to the President at Hollins College; her Harvard dissertation (1973) was "The Archetype of the Journey; Studies in Bunyan, Smollett, and Conrad."

DOUGLAS C. STANGE, whose Harvard dissertation (1974) was "Patterns of Antislavery Among American Unitarians, 1813-1860," is also the author of *Radicalism for Humanity; A Study of Lutheran Abolitionism* (1970) and of several articles, including "The Third Lecture: One Hundred and Fifty Years of Anti-Popery at Harvard," in the October 1968 HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN. He is now Assistant Professor of History at Chadron State College.

FRANCIS JACQUES SYPHER has contributed "A History of Harpers' Latin Dictionary" to the October 1972 HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN and "Victoria's Lapse from Virtue: A Lost Leaf from Swinburne's *La Sœur de la Reine*" to the October 1973 issue; his edition of Swinburne's novel, *A Year's Letters*, was published by the New York University Press in 1974, and at present he is preparing a volume of *The Reader's Adviser* for publication by the R. R. Bowker Company.

SISTER STEPHANIE VINCEC is Visiting Assistant Professor of English at the University of Western Ontario; her dissertation (1975) at McMaster University was "A Variant Edition of Henry James's *The Wings of the Dove*."

ROLAND JOHN WILEY teaches at the School of Music of the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor; his Harvard dissertation (1974) was "Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake: The First Productions in Moscow and St. Petersburg."
