CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

MARCEL FRANÇON, Associate Professor of French Literature, *Emeritus*, at Harvard, has written many books and articles and is the editor of a number of sixteenth-century French texts. His article "On the Rondeaux of Christine de Pisan" appeared in the October 1973 issue of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

PHILIP HOFER, Curator of Printing and Graphic Arts in the Harvard College Library, *Emeritus*, and Honorary Curator of Asian Graphic Arts of the William Hayes Fogg Art Museum, founded the Library's Department of Printing and Graphic Arts in 1938 and headed it until his retirement in 1968. His numerous publications include fourteen contributions to previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, and he was the subject of an article by Peter A. Wick, "Philip Hofer, Scholar-Collector," in the issue for July 1968.

AKIKO MURAKATA is now associated with the Kyoto National Museum. Her dissertation at George Washington University was on "The Selected Letters of Dr. William Sturgis Bigelow," and she contributed "Ernest F. Fenollosa's 'Ode on Re-incarnation'" to the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN for January 1973.

MABEL POTTER began her research on John Donne while assisting her husband, the late Professor George R. Potter, in work on the 10-volume edition of Donne's *Sermons* which he and Evelyn M. Simpson edited for publication (1953-62) by the University of California Press. Mrs. Potter continued her work on the Dobell manuscript while a Scholar at the Radcliffe Institute from 1965 to 1967.

ARTHUR BERNON TOURTELLOT, who has been Vice-President of the Columbia Broadcasting System since 1968, is a member of the Harvard Class of 1935 and of the Board of Overseers' Committee to Visit the University Library. His books include *The Charles* (a volume in the *Rivers of America* series) and *An Anatomy of American Politics*; his activities in broadcasting include eight years as Associate Producer of *The March of Time*.

JAMES E. WALSH, Keeper of Printed Books in the Houghton Library of the Harvard College Library, has contributed to five previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, most recently in October 1969, when he wrote on "The *Querela Pacis* of Erasmus: The 'Lost' French Translation."
