## CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

HOWARD MUMFORD JONES, Abbott Lawrence Lowell Professor of the Humanities, *Emeritus*, at Harvard, was Editor of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, 1966-1967; the most recent of his numerous books (edited in collaboration with his wife, Bessie Zaban Jones) is *The Many Voices of Boston—A Historical Anthology 1630-1975*, published by Atlantic/Little, Brown.

JOEL MYERSON, Assistant Professor of English Language and Literature at the University of South Carolina, is the author of bibliographies of Melville and of Margaret Fuller; his other published writings include contributions to the July 1973 and October 1974 issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

CECILIA HELENA PAYNE-GAPOSCHKIN is Phillips Professor of Astronomy, *Emerita*, at Harvard; her published books include *Stellar Atmospheres* (1925), *The Stars of High Luminosity* (1930), *Variable Stars & Galactic Structures* (1954), *Stars in the Making* (1952), *Introduction to Astronomy* (1954; 2nd ed., 1970), and *The Galactic Novae* (1957; 2nd ed., 1964).

JON PEARSON PERRY won the William Harris Arnold and Gertrude Weld Arnold Prize at Harvard in 1968 with an essay on Jean de Tournes; he has recently completed a Harvard dissertation on *Poliscena*, a Latin humanist comedy of the early Renaissance.

CAROLINE ROBBINS, Professor Emeritus of History at Bryn Mawr College, has edited a number of seventeenth-century texts; her *The Eighteenth-Century Commonwealthman* was published by the Harvard University Press in 1959 and a previous article on Hollis, "Library of Liberty—Assembled for Harvard College by Thomas Hollis of Lincoln's Inn," appeared in the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, V (1951), 5-23, 181-196.
