## A HARVARD LIBRARY BIBLIOGRAPHY: SUPPLEMENT

This is a list of new books and articles of which any unit of the Harvard University Library is the author, the publisher, or the subject. The bibliography for 1960-1966 appeared in the *HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN*, XV (1967), 99-107, and two or three supplements per annum have appeared in subsequent issues.

### *I. Serials and Continuing Works in Parts*

No. 1. (This lists 46 Hebrew serials, 13 Yiddish serials, and collections of ephemera on the 1977 elections, elections of 1949-1973, political parties, the Non-Zionist orthodox, charities, and defense forces.)

No. 2. (This lists 57 additional Hebrew and 2 additional Yiddish serials; there is a cumulative index that includes the serials listed in *Checklist* No. 1.)

No. 3 — *German Judaica Pamphlets*. (Some 2,000 German-language Judaica pamphlets are listed, in the format of the *Widener Library Shelflist*, by author and title, by date of publication, and by place of publication.)

(The *Catalogue* was published in 54 volumes in 1963, with Supplements in 1970 [12 vols.], 1971 [6 vols.], and 1976 [7 vols.] The Fourth Supplement lists by author and subject some 90,000 entries for materials received and indexed at the Library from June 1975 through December 1977.)

RICHARD TITLEBAUM, a member of the Harvard Class of 1960, won the Ruskin Prize and the William Harris Arnold and Gertrude Weld Arnold Prize while a graduate student; his doctoral dissertation at Harvard (1969) was "Three Victorian Views of the Italian Renaissance: John Ruskin, Walter Pater, and John Addington Symonds."
