CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

DAVID H. BURTON, Professor of History at St. Joseph's College, Philadelphia, is the author of several articles and books, including *Theodore Roosevelt, Confident Imperialist* (University of Pennsylvania Press, 1969), *Theodore Roosevelt: A Biography* (Twayne, 1972), and *Theodore Roosevelt and His English Correspondents* (American Philosophical Society, 1973).

ROBERT MURRAY DAVIS, Professor of English at the University of Oklahoma, wrote "The Externalist Method in the Novels of Ronald Firbank" as his dissertation at the University of Wisconsin (1964), is a bibliographer of Evelyn Waugh, and has edited volumes of critical essays on Waugh, Steinbeck, and the modern novel generally.

MARCEL FRANÇON, Associate Professor of French Literature, *Emeritus*, at Harvard, has edited a number of sixteenth-century French texts and is the author of numerous books and articles, including contributions to three previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

MARY HYDE is the author of *The Impossible Friendship: Boswell and Mrs. Thrale*, which was published by the Harvard University Press in 1972 following its serialization in the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN; her earlier works include *Playwriting for Elizabethans, 1600-1605*, based on her dissertation, which was published by the Columbia University Press in 1949. A collector as well as an author and scholar, she is a member of the Overseers' Committee to Visit the Harvard University Library, and also an active friend of the Columbia, Yale, and Pierpont Morgan Libraries.

EMILY B. LYLE was a Fellow of the Radcliffe Institute for 1974-75; her dissertation at Leeds was "A Study of 'Thomas the Rhymer' and 'Tam Lin' in Literature and Tradition," and in 1975 the Scottish Text Society published volume I of her edition of *Andrew Crawford's Collection of Ballads and Songs*. She is now associated with the School of Scottish Studies of the University of Edinburgh.
