## CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

MARCIA ALLENTUCK, Associate Professor of English and Comparative Literature at The City College of the City University of New York and Senior Research Fellow in Landscape Architecture at Dumbarton Oaks, Harvard University (1972-1973), contributed "Flaxman and Klopstock: A New Letter" to the January 1971 issue of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN; her dissertation at Columbia (1964) was on Henry Fuseli.

MRS. BAYARA AROUTUNOVA is Lecturer on Slavic Languages and Literatures at Harvard. Her Radcliffe dissertation (1958) was on "Linguistic and Stylistic Problems of Word Order in Modern Russian."

ZBIGNIEW BRZEZINSKI is Professor of Public Law and Government and Director of the Research Institute on Communist Affairs at Columbia University. His many articles and books include *Between Two Ages: America's Role in the Technetronic Era*, which was published by Viking in 1970.

NORMAN S. FIERING earned his doctorate at Columbia and taught at Stanford for several years prior to 1969, when he went as a Fellow to the Institute of Early American History and Culture at Williamsburg, Virginia; he is now Editor of Publications at the Institute.

PAUL A. FREUND came to the Harvard faculty in 1939 after some years of government service, and has been Carl M. Loeb University Professor since 1958. Among his many publications is *On Law and Justice* (Harvard University Press, 1968).

MARY HYDE, author and collector, collaborated with her husband, the late Donald F. Hyde, on several books and articles and in forming the private library of which the Harvard College Library published a three-volume catalogue in 1965: *Catalogus Bibliothecae Hydeanae; The Hyde Collection of the Works of Samuel Johnson*, comp. by J. D. Fleeman

ROMAN JAKOBSON is Samuel Hazzard Cross Professor of Slavic Languages and Literatures, *Emeritus*, at Harvard and Institute Professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He is a prolific author in several languages, and has been honored by *Festschriften* published in 1956, 1967 (3 vols.), and 1968.

PATRICK GREIG SCOTT is a member of the Department of English Literature at the University of Edinburgh; his published works include *Tennyson's Enoch Arden: A Victorian Best-Seller*, which was issued by the Tennyson Society in 1970.
