## CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

SISTER MAUREEN FARRELL, F.C.J., is associated with the Department of History of Science and Technology of the University of Manchester Institute of Science and Technology, where her dissertation (1973) was written on the life and works of William Whiston.

WALTER GROSSMANN, Director of Libraries and Professor of History at the University of Massachusetts, Boston, is editing the *Sämtliche Schriften* of Johann Christian Edelmann in thirteen volumes, of which eleven have been published thus far by Friedrich Frommann Verlag. His Harvard dissertation (1951) was "Schiller's Idea of History," and from 1952 to 1967 he was on the staff of the Harvard Library, where he was the second Archibald Cary Coolidge Bibliographer; he has contributed to three previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

PHILIP HOFER, Curator of Printing and Graphic Arts in the Harvard College Library, *Emeritus*, and Honorary Curator of Asian Graphic Arts of the William Hayes Fogg Art Museum, founded the Library's Department of Printing and Graphic Arts in 1938 and headed it until his retirement in 1968. His numerous publications include fifteen contributions to previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN, and he was the subject of an article by Peter A. Wick, "Philip Hofer, Scholar-Collector," in the issue for July 1968.

MARY HYDE, a member of the Overseers' Committee to Visit the Harvard University Library and of the Editorial Committee for the Yale Edition of Samuel Johnson's *Works*, is an author, scholar, and collector. *Playwriting for Elizabethans, 1600-1605* (published by the Columbia University Press in 1949) grew out of her dissertation; *The Impossible Friendship: Boswell and Mrs. Thrale* was published by the Harvard University Press in 1972 following its serialization in the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN.

RICHARD S. KENNEDY, Professor of English at Temple University, wrote his Harvard dissertation in 1953 on Thomas Wolfe, and *The Window of Memory: The Literary Career of Thomas Wolfe* was published by the University of North Carolina Press in 1962; he has also contributed articles on Wolfe to two previous issues of the HARVARD LIBRARY BULLETIN. At present he is at work on a critical biography of E. E. Cummings.
